1 Thursday The RBAK General Assembly was scheduled to take place in Kasei, Pokot North, from today. But the host church has requested to postpone the meeting citing communal fears of the Covid-19 virus, since there will be delegates from across the country. Please pray for the 23 member churches that unity of mind and purpose will still prevail in the fledgling Association.

2 Friday MI and his family has been away in Meru for his annual leave (vacation) for the whole of September. The time was also used to settle some of the family succession disputes. We pray that he would be more productive in the ministry now that some of the family issues have been sorted.

3 Saturday Post Covid worship arrangements have remarkably changed in the last month. While the Government has slowly eased the regulations, many Christians have become tired of being away from their 'spiritual home' and some of the older church members have come back for worship.

4 Sunday Ministry today. (1) Nairobi: EA is preaching one more Beatitude this morning and DK is preaching in the afternoon. (2) MI is away in Siaya today to help with the new plans for Roy Omondi and family to relocate to minister in Siaya. See also 12/10.

5 Monday This evening over Zoom KU is speaking to the Christian Union at **Sheffield** University at a meeting named 'Equip'. The subject is 'My missionary journey' with the aim of motivating these young people with the Great Commission. Benedict Allmand-Smith is the President of the group.
