Dear Brethren,

I had started to draft this Newsletter to tell you the arrangements for the proposed visit to Kenya that was scheduled for late next week (leaving June 12). But I have had to cancel it because Priscilla suffered a small stroke two weeks ago. She is back at home, but very tired, and I need to care for her in this recovery period. Humanly speaking, this is a big disappointment for us both, as even Mama has been preparing for months for me to take things to those to be visited. Yet there is much to be thankful for: it could have been much worse, it has provided opportunities for witness, and the love of God's people has a further opportunity to be demonstrated. We are also brought face to face again with the hope in Christ that we have that nothing, not even death, can take away.

Since our visit in March the brethren have been hard at work with all kinds of ministry.

(1) They are seeking their own registration as churches with the Government. This has entailed a visit of the three of them to Nairobi, but these days much is done online. One requirement the Government has is that at least one of the officials has formal ministerial training. All three went through the TPC in Nairobi about 20 years ago.

(2) Adult Literacy continues in Wasat. There are 2 classes—'group A quick to understand and group B too slow in understanding'.



(3) Bible Light College

The church building at Kasei is on the right. The building in the centre is what they are calling Block B which is for housing the students. They hope it will be complete before the next classes in July.



This is the morning devotions during May classes. The 2nd. years studied the Doctrine of the Church (7 in attendance), and 1st. years the Doctrine of God (6). One or two are having problems with the English language, and they are considering having a simplified course for some already in church leadership. This College is vital for the maturing of the churches.
